Genealogy News You May Have Missed

Family History Books – Free PDF versions of genealogy books are available from [FamilySearch](#), the website we mentioned in the August 2012 issue of *Walton Relations* for providing free access to census records. The great thing about the PDF versions of these books is that they are searchable. Open a book you want to explore (no need to save it to your computer because it is always online) and use the “Find” tool in the Edit menu of the [Adobe Reader](#) to find your surnames. Even if the book is indexed, the Find tool is faster than you are! Here is a description of the collection:

Family History Books is a collection of more than 40,000 digitized genealogy and family history publications from the archives of some of the most important family history libraries in the world. The collection includes family histories, county and local histories, genealogy magazines and how-to books, gazetteers, and medieval histories and pedigrees. “Pin” your online research finds, such as census or vital-records images, and organize them on “boards” like giant scrapbook pages. Online images, which you can annotate, retain links to their original locations. You also can upload files, such as old family photos, from your computer. You can share everything on Pinterest with fellow researchers.
